*** For Hood, choose courses carefully depending on Concentration. Creative Writing: ENGL 210. Drama & Theatre: THEA 102 or 107.

Transfer Institution Information

Towson University offers a Bachelor of Arts in English with Tracks in Literature or Writing and English – Secondary Education, and combined Bachelor of Science + Master of Science in Professional Writing.

University of Maryland Baltimore County (UMBC) offers a Bachelor of Arts in English with Tracks in Communication & Technology and Literature. Only one of four English major courses required by FCC may transfer to UMBC (with the permission of an advisor) as English major courses; the remainder must be taken at UMBC as 300 or 400-level courses. Students may choose to complete their program at FCC, as doing so is unlikely to cause a delay in graduation from UMBC. Some students may choose to complete Gen Eds and transferable English courses at FCC and move on to UMBC before earning the Associate degree.

University of Maryland College Park offers a Bachelor of Arts in English with specializations in Literary & Cultural Studies, Language, Writing, & Rhetoric, Creative Writing, and Media Studies. Only two of four English major courses required by FCC will transfer to UMCP as English major courses; the remainder must be taken at UMCP as 300 or 400-level courses. Students may choose to complete their program at FCC, as doing so is unlikely to cause a delay in graduation from College Park. Some students may choose to complete Gen Eds and transferable English courses at FCC and move on to College Park before earning the Associate degree.

Hood College offers a Bachelor of Arts in English with Concentrations in Literature, Creative Writing, and Drama & Theatre. Students who transfer to Hood College with a completed A.A. will have met Hood’s lower level general education core requirements, and will not need to take World Languages.

Advising

Students should meet with an advisor each semester to carefully select and sequence courses based on their specific academic goals and interests.

Completing the Pathway

Students who take fewer than 15 credits each semester or who require developmental English or math coursework will need additional semesters to complete their degrees. Summer and January term classes may help students to make faster progress. General Education CORE courses can often be taken in any semester. One course must be designated as a Cultural Competence course. A minimum of nine credits must be taken at the 200 level. Refer to the college catalog (frederick.edu/class-schedules) for course details and the list of General Education and Cultural Competence classes.

Reverse Transfer
