Salisbury University FCC has an articulation agreement with Salisbury from Sociology for Social Work; see an advisor for details.

Shepherd University offers a Bachelor of Science in Sociology with concentrations in "Traditional" and Criminal Justice.

Towson University offers an undergraduate major in Sociology-Anthropology with concentrations in Sociology, Anthropology, and Criminal Justice.

Hood College Students who transfer to Hood College with a completed A.A. will have met Hood's lower level general education core requirements, and will not need to take World Languages.

Advising

Students should meet with an advisor each semester to carefully select and sequence courses based on their specific academic goals and interests. Completing the Pathway

Students who take fewer than 15 credits each semester or who require developmental English or math coursework will need additional semesters to complete their degrees. Summer and January term classes may help students to make faster progress.

General Education CORE courses can often be taken in any semester. One course must be designated as a Cultural Competence course. A minimum of nine credits must be taken at the 200 level. Refer to the college catalog (frederick.edu/class-schedules) for course details and the list of General Education and Cultural Competence classes.

Reverse Transfer
