Guided Pathway to Success (GPS) Suggested schedules map your path to degree completion.

Full-time student: Follow the green blocks in order.

Part-time student: Follow the blue course sequence at your own pace.

Students should meet with an advisor each semester to carefully select and sequence courses based on their specific academic goals and interests. Listed EMGT courses are 5-week online FCC courses, offered during spring, summer, and fall semesters, and enrolled in after completing the required FEMA IS prerequisites. This Letter program is designed with this in mind, and may be completed significantly more or less quickly than suggested here. Contact with an Emergency Management advisor is therefore strongly encouraged, to allow for careful selection of the coursework and pacing that best suit the individual student.
