Transfer Institution Information

University of Maryland Baltimore County Admission to the Visual Art program requires a portfolio. The Visual Arts major has concentrations in Animation, Art History & Museum Studies, Cinematic Arts, Graphic Design, Intermedia, Photography, and Print Media.

University of Maryland College Park The Bachelor of Arts in Studio Art is an open program with no portfolio admission requirement. Other program options include Studio Art with Advanced Specialization, and Studio Art with a Concentration in Graphic Design. Areas of Concentration in Painting and Drawing, Printmaking, Sculpture, Digital Media, and Graphic Design. Minimum GPA is 2.0 for students with an Associate's degree or 56 credits. Students with fewer than 56 credits and less than 3.0 will be admitted on a space available basis.

Towson University Degree Track and Concentration options include Design Studies, Fine Arts, Ceramics, Digital Art + Design, Graphic Design, Illustration, Interdisciplinary Object Design, Metalsmithing + Jewelry, Painting, Drawing + Printmaking, Photo Imaging, Sculpture; majors in Art Education, Art History. Minimum GPA: 2.0 for students with an Associate's degree or 56 credits. Students with 30 – 55 credits a min 2.75 GPA is required for admission.

Hood College Bachelor of Art in Art and Archaeology with Concentrations in Archaeology, Art Education, Art History, and Studio Art. Minimum GPA 2.0 for admission. Students who transfer to Hood College with a completed A.A. will have met Hood's lower level general education core requirements, and will not need to take World Languages.

Frostburg State University For students who have completed 24 or more credits: Minimum 2.0 GPA for admission. For students who have completed fewer than 24 college-level credits: 2.5 GPA for admission

Advising

Students should meet with an advisor each semester to carefully select and sequence courses based on their specific academic goals and interests.

Completing the Pathway

Students who take fewer than 15 credits each semester or who require developmental English or math coursework will need additional semesters to complete their degrees. Summer and January term classes may help students to make faster progress.

General Education CORE courses can often be taken in any semester. One course must be designated as a Cultural Competence course. A minimum of nine credits must be taken at the 200 level. Refer to the college catalog (frederick.edu/class-schedules) for course details and the list of General Education and Cultural Competence classes.

Reverse Transfer
