Transfer Institution Information

Hood Students who transfer to Hood College with a completed A.A. will have met Hood's lower level general education core requirements, and will not need to take World Languages. Hood offers a Bachelor of Arts in History, a concentration in Public History, and minors in History and Public History.

Mount St. Mary's offers a Bachelor of Arts in History with optional concentrations in Applied History – Digital and Applied History – History & Business.

University of Maryland College Park offers a Bachelor of Arts in History (with an area of concentration that is geographical, chronological, or thematic) and a History minor.

Towson offers a Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science in History and a History Secondary Education Concentration.

Advising

Students should meet with an advisor each semester to carefully select and sequence courses based on their specific academic goals and interests.

Completing the Pathway

Students who take fewer than 15 credits each semester or who require developmental English or math coursework will need additional semesters to complete their degrees. Summer and January term classes may help students to make faster progress.

General Education CORE courses can often be taken in any semester. One course must be designated as a Cultural Competence course. A minimum of nine credits must be taken at the 200 level. Refer to the college catalog (frederick.edu/class-schedules) for course details and the list of General Education and Cultural Competence classes.
