### General Note about transferring to four-year Music programs

Music is a unique discipline in that most college music programs require students to not only complete course requirements, but also to demonstrate proficiency in music performance via auditions and juries. In addition, there are many sub-genres of college-level music study (education, performance, theory, history, therapy, and more). Frederick Community College Music students have the opportunity to develop their aural and keyboard skills, to study Music Theory, and to participate in applied lessons and ensembles each semester. Many FCC Music students find that these experiences prepare them to be successful at transfer auditions and placement tests. However, the degree to which these FCC Music credits directly transfer to a four-year school will vary depending on the transfer institution and a student's audition and placement tests. It is important for Music majors to meet regularly with an advisor.

**To discuss your opportunities for transfer in Music, work with the Music Program Manager and the four-year school to which you hope to transfer.**

### Transfer Institution Information

**Mount St. Mary's University** offers a Bachelor of Arts in Fine Arts with a concentration in Music. There is no required audition for admission.

**University of Maryland Baltimore County (UMBC)** offers a Bachelor of Arts in Music Education, Music Performance (Instrumental or Vocal), Music Composition, and Music Technology and a Bachelor of Arts in Jazz Studies. A required audition and placement tests determine transferability of some FCC music courses.

**Shepherd University** offers a Bachelor of Music in Performance, a Bachelor of Music Education, and a Bachelor of Arts in Music. Admission is by audition.

**University of Maryland College Park** offers a Bachelor of Arts in Music, a Bachelor of Music, and a Bachelor of Music Education. Admission is by audition.

**Towson University** Admission to the Towson Music major is by audition. In addition to the Bachelor of Music, Towson offers a Bachelor of Science in Music, a Music Education major, and minors in Music.

### Advising

Students should meet with an advisor each semester to carefully select and sequence courses based on their specific academic goals and interests. **Completing the Pathway** Students who take fewer than 15 credits each semester or who require developmental English or math coursework will need additional semesters to complete their degrees. Summer and January term classes may help students to make faster progress. General Education CORE courses can often be taken in any semester. One course must be designated as a Cultural Competence course. A minimum of nine credits must be taken at the 200 level. **Reverse Transfer** FCC students who transfer to another school may transfer credits *back to FCC* from that school to fulfill FCC associate degree requirements.
