FCC Curriculum Pathway

Curriculum Pathways at FCC provides full-time, first-time college students with a recommended framework for completing an Associate degree in two years (four semesters). Using the Curriculum Pathway along with the PeopleSoft Degree Plan empowers students to track their progress towards graduation.

Students in the Emergency Management AAS: Track I FEMA Independent Study program typically can address core requirements faster as they often have General Education transfer credit that allows them to complete the degree in less time. In addition, the five week online EM Module format provides the opportunity for students to complete all core requirements in a single semester. It is strongly recommended all students work with the Emergency Management Academic Program Manager each semester to carefully select and sequence courses based on their specific interests and needs.
